THE UNSOLVED PROBLEM:

Today, 37,000 Oakland households—primarily in East and West Oakland—are without devices or internet access.

Unconnected residents are not evenly distributed throughout Oakland.

2020-2023: IMPACT TO DATE

2020

City Council invests \$7.7M of CARES Act funding to launch OakWiFi and the TownLink program to provide free public Wi-Fi and digital literacy to residents across Oakland.

2021

Oakland is selected for the State's historic \$3.25B investment in open access, backbone broadband infrastructure in Oakland's most unconnected neighborhoods—West Oakland, Fruitvale, and East Oakland.

2022

Oakland is awarded a \$500k state grant to design an expansive fiber optic network, streamline deployment, and enable public-private partnerships to provide free or low-cost internet.

Oakland is recognized as a National Digital Inclusion Alliance Trailblazing City.

2023

Oakland is prioritized on the state broadband map for upcoming generational State and Federal investments in broadband infrastructure.

CITY-WIDE BROADBAND STRATEGY COMMUNITY CONNECTIVITY

OUR SOLUTION:

Connect at least 90% of unconnected Oakland households to reliable, high-speed broadband internet within 5 years.

2023-2024: LOOKING AHEAD

Increase availability of lower-cost and FREE high-speed internet



INCREASE FEDERAL BROADBAND SUBSIDY ADOPTION:

Enroll an additional 9,000 unconnected East and West Oakland households in the Affordable Connectivity Program.

IMPROVE BROADBAND MARKETPLACE:

Leveraging generational State and Federal infrastructure investments to increase competition and innovation in the broadband market.





DEPLOY FREE WI-FI IN AFFORDABLE HOUSING

Deploy free Wi-Fi as a utility service in Oakland's affordable housing communities.
